


STRATEGIC PLAN: LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

In 2016, the TBF made strong progress on our Year One goals. We increased our digital presence through more frequent blogs and social media posts, reached far and wide to ensure the diversity of our author list, and added additional revenue streams with ticketed Festival sessions, additional Festival book sales sites, and on-site Lit Crawl donations. On the outreach front, we raised funds and established a plan to bring Reading Rock Stars to Dallas in 2017, and increased the profile of the Texas Teen Book Festival through increased attendance and sponsorships.






Festival Authors Comparison



FESTIVAL IMPACT


Rain didn't discourage 50,000 people from attending the 21st annual Festival Weekend, held on November 5 & 6 in and around the Texas State Capitol. New features this year included the Young Adult HQ tent, venue book sales, ticketed events, and a Marcus Samuelsson brunch at local favorite Olamaie. Even as the Festival grows and evolves, it remains free and open to the public, continuing to welcome and inspire all book lovers.





BOOK SALES

In 2016, we increased book sales at the Festival by 19% to \$234,619. Strategies to increase book sales included making book tickets available in advance for Nick Offerman and T.C. Boyle, placing book sales and signings in select large venues, and messaging to convey that book sales not only support authors but also the Festival. Through book sales, the TBF is able to secure award-winning and popular authors, support the strong reputation of the Festival with authors and publishers, and increase Festival revenue as Barnes & Noble donates 15% of book sales to the TBF.



JAN HUGHES VOLUNTEER AWARD

This year, we recognized Stephanie Kaynes and Christopher Thibert for their long-standing and invaluable service to the Festival.



TEXAS WRITER AWARD

Author Benjamin Alire Sáenz received the Texas Writer Award in recognition of his outstanding contributions to Texas literature.

LIT CRAWL

A collaboration between the Texas Book Festival and the Litquake Foundation, Lit Crawl Austin celebrated its sixth year of irreverent literary programming. On Saturday, November 3, more than 2,000 book enthusiasts and more than 50 authors and poets joined us on East Cesar Chavez for a night of performances, trivia matches, and all-ages storytelling sessions. Participating authors included R.L. Stine, Chigozie Obioma, and Eileen Myles. Partnering organizations included the O. Henry Museum, the Texas Library Association and Texas State Library and Archives Commission, fields, Deep Vellum Publishing, Awst Press, Newfound, American Short Fiction, Five Things, Mystery People, and Bat City Review.



TEXAS TEEN BOOK FESTIVAL

The Texas Teen Book Festival was held at St. Edward's University on Saturday, October 1, 2016. For the first time ever, TTBF featured:

- Costume Contest, sponsored by Fierce Reads
- Barrio Writers Featured Author Sponsorship, given to Isabel Quintero in partnership with the Tomás Rivera Mexican American Children's Book Award
- Alamo Drafthouse Author Welcome Party and Film Screening, the first TTBF ticketed event

Gifted 8,798 books to elementary school students in Title I schools in Austin, Houston, and the Rio Grande Valley through Reading Rock Stars.



Library Grants Collection Allocations



Since 1995, the Texas Book Festival has given more than 81,000 books to Title I elementary students and nearly \$3 million to Texas public libraries. Through the Fresh Ink Fiction Contest, 81 teen authors have won recognition and participated in their own Festival panel.






FIRST EDITION LITERARY GALA


In 2016, the First Edition Literary Gala was held at the Four Seasons in Austin, Texas on Friday, November 3. The Gala raised a total of \$662,752, a 13% increase over 2015. The Gala featured authors Diane Guerrero, Ethan Hawke, Carl Hiassen, Greg Ruth, and Marcus Samuelsson, and was emceed by Jon Sciezscka. All proceeds support libraries and schools in Texas, and keep the Festival free for all.






INCOME AND EXPENSES

Foundations and individual sponsors continue to be crucial sources of income for the Festival in 2016. The TBF met budget with \$1,414,313 in contributions, and \$1,359,848 in expenses. Additional highlights in 2016 included \$8,810 from individual donors through Amplify Austin, a 19% increase in Festival book sales, and \$90,296.97 worth of in-kind donations.
