#### TEXAS BOOK FESTIVAL 2022 ANNUAL REPORT

2022 marked the return of a fully in-person Texas Book Festival—and it was glorious!

Over 300 authors and 40,000 attendees joined us in and around the Texas State Capitol on November 5–6, 2022. We had a whirlwind of a weekend filled with thought-provoking conversations, joy, and laughter as readers of all ages connected with authors and discovered new books to love.

Last year we also brought our programs back to schools and organizations throughout Texas as part of Reading Rock Stars and Real Reads. We partnered with a record number of schools this year —29 total—and gave books to almost 14,000 students. Through our statewide Library Grants program, we awarded \$101,000 in acquisitions grants to support our public libraries.

Books and writers connected us during the pandemic, and they brought us back together in 2022—in schools in Austin, Dallas, Fort Worth, Houston, and the Rio Grande Valley, and at the Capitol on a beautiful weekend last November. In these pages we look back on a great year of impacting communities through a shared love of books. Thank you for being a part of this vision.

### **FESTIVAL IMPACT**

In 2022, Texas Book Festival returned to a fully in-person Festival in and around the Texas State Capitol the weekend of November 5–6. We hosted a total of 304 authors in 195 Festival sessions ranging from children's and teen programming to a diverse slate of panels for adult audiences, including playful evening events as part of Lit Crawl.

Throughout the weekend, the Festival featured culinary legend and sixteen-time James Beard Award recipient Jacques Pépin; Screen Actors Guild Award recipient and nine-time NAACP Image Award winner Omar Epps; Grammy-nominated "Best New Artist" Margo Price; and other nationally and critically recognized authors including Angie Cruz, Janet Evanovich, Gabino Iglesias, Sandra Brown, David George Haskell, Rebecca Roanhorse, and many more. The National Book Foundation, PEN America, the Whiting Awards, the Writers' League of Texas, the Michener Center for Writers, *The Atlantic*, and the Austin Public Library participated in the Festival through programming and promotional partnerships.









### **TEXAS WRITER AWARD**


The Texas Writer Award is given each year to a writer recognition of in outstanding contributions to Texas letters and literary arts. The 2022 recipient was Elizabeth McCracken, the author of eight books including The Souvenir Museum (long-listed for the National Book Award), Bowlaway, Thunderstruck & Other Stories (winner of the 2014 Story Prize and long-listed for the National Book Award), and The Giant's National Book Award House (a finalist). McCracken has received grants and fellowships from the Guggenheim Foundation, the National Endowment for the Arts, the Liguria Study Center, the American Academy in Berlin, the Fine Arts Work Center in Provincetown, and the Radcliffe Institute for Advanced Study. Her work has been published in The Best American Short Stories, The Pushcart Prize, The O.Henry Prize, the New York Times Magazine, and many other places.

### 2022 FESTIVAL POSTER ARTIST

The 2022 Texas Book Festival poster artist was Minta Maria. Minta was born in Madrid and raised in San Antonio. She received her BA in Journalism from the University of Texas and MFA in Photography & Related Media from the School of Visual Arts. Over the past ten years of developing her art, Minta has had a variety of exhibitions and worked to build upon the themes of memory, tradition, and the fragility of information.



### YEAR-ROUND PROGRAMMING

We produced seventeen year-round sessions in 2022. Our year-round lineup included a virtual book club with Good Morning America "Buzz Pick" author Jenny Tinghui Zhang in partnership with Gen Padalecki and her Now & Gen book club. Later in the year, TBF hosted a virtual panel with Golden Globe Award-nominated actress Constance Wu about her memoir *Making a Scene*.

In 2022, TBF partnered for in-person events with Waterloo Greenway for their Morning Glories early childhood education series and with Austin Park Foundation on their Playdates in the Park series, bringing in children's authors Divya Srinivasan, Anne Wynter, Don Tate, and Nicholas Solis for story time events and book giveaways that were free and open to the public.

Additional authors in the year-round lineup included Selma Blair, Chandler Baker, Steve Harrigan, Sindya Bhanoo, Dalia Azim, Juli Berwald, Katie Gutierrez, Christina Soontornvat, Mark Updegrove, and Natalia Sylvester.



### LIT CRAWL



Lit Crawl Austin celebrated its twelfth anniversary this year by featuring ten events across four venues in East Austin—Vintage Bookstore and Wine Bar, East Tiger E. 7th Street, Hillside Farmacy, and Saddle Up.

Lit Crawl Austin 2022 included programming partnerships with Diverse Voices Book Review, Literary Death Match, EcoTheo Collective / LOGOS, *American Short Fiction*, Writers' League of Texas, Noir at the Bar, Story Department, One Page Salon, and Librotraficantes.

### **READING ROCK STARS**

Reading Rock Stars brings nationally recognized children's authors and their books to students in Title I elementary schools around the state of Texas. TBF makes a three-year commitment to each school in the program, providing resources and a comprehensive curriculum guide so students can fully engage with the book and author. Since the program's inception, we've given more than 161,000 brand new, hardcover books to students and hosted more than 730 author visits in Austin, Houston, Dallas, Fort Worth, and the Rio Grande Valley.




### **REAL READS**

In 2022, we held 5 Real Reads programs that provided young people with the opportunity to engage with acclaimed authors and their work. Through the program, 590 books were provided to students at Skyline High School, Austin Community College's Ascender program, Somos Escritoras. Girl Scouts. and Breakthrough Central Texas. Featured authors included Jasmine Warga, Julian Randall, Celia C. Pérez, Ruben Degollado, and Kalynn Bayron.

### LIBRARY GRANTS

In 2022, we gave \$101,000 in collection enhancement grants to 42 libraries across the state of Texas. Since 1995, we have awarded more than \$3.2 million in grants, bringing much-needed brand-new books into communities, including books in languages that reflect those communities.

Every year, the Texas Book Festival works hard to engage and grow the Festival Friend donor community (donations between \$100-\$500) Thanks to the support of Libro.fm and *Texas Monthly*, we were able to thank these donors with priority access to exciting sessions, free Libro.fm audiobooks, and annual subscriptions to *Texas Monthly* for donors who gave \$250 or more. We raised \$46,417 from 325 Festival Friends.

The 2022 Texas Book Festival First Edition Literary Gala was held on Friday, November 4 at the Fairmont Hotel in downtown Austin. After many years at the Four Seasons, we needed to find a new venue to accommodate the 700+ guests who attended our 2022 Gala!






