JON FLAMING ANNOUNCED AS THE 2023 TEXAS BOOK FESTIVAL POSTER ARTIST

AUSTIN, TX (July 13, 2023) - Texas Book Festival is thrilled to reveal Jon Flaming as the 2023 Festival Poster Artist. His artwork *Cowboy Reading in Big Bend* is the official 2023 Festival Poster Image.

Born in Wichita, Kansas in 1962, Flaming moved to Texas in 1967. The artist grew up in Dallas/Richardson. His fine art is in the permanent collections of the Tyler Museum of Art, The Grace Museum in Abilene, The Museum of the Southwest, and the San Angelo Museum of Fine Art. His work is also in many private and public collections and has been exhibited in numerous solo and group shows.

"Jon Flaming's image *Cowboy Reading in Big Bend* is abstract and visually sophisticated but uniquely Texan through and through," said DJ Stout, of design firm <u>Pentagram</u>. "He truly is the Picasso of Texas art."

Every year, Texas Book Festival chooses an artist and work that reflects the spirit of the Festival including imagination, creativity, and community. The artist always has a strong Texas affiliation, and the work captures the diversity of Texas culture.

"Selecting an artist and work of art to represent our beloved Festival has been a privilege and a lot of fun," says interim executive director Dalia Azim. "Flaming's Cowboy Reading in Big Bend beautifully represents the activity of engaging with books and what we most love to celebrate and cultivate at Texas Book Festival."
