Texas Book Festival Hosts 29th Annual First Edition Literary Gala on Friday, November 15th

(Austin, Texas) - Texas Book Festival announced its **2024 First Edition Literary Gala** taking place Friday, November 15 at 6:00 pm at the <u>Fairmont Austin</u>. This annual fundraiser provides essential resources to fulfill Texas Book Festival's mission and fund their literary programs. The event celebrates books, authors, and literacy and will feature a distinguished lineup of authors from this year's Festival.

2024 Gala speakers include:

Jay Ellis (Headlining Author)

Born in Sumter, South Carolina, to a military family, **Jay Ellis** spent his childhood inventing new personas for every town he landed in. After college, he moved to Hollywood, where he got his start in a recurring role on BET's *The Game*. An actor, philanthropist, and entrepreneur, Ellis is best known for his role as Lawrence on HBO's *Insecure*, for which he won an NAACP Image Award. He appeared alongside Tom Cruise in *Top Gun: Maverick*. Ellis is the author of the 2024 memoir *Did Everyone Have an Imaginary Friend (or Just Me)?: Adventures in Boyhood*.

Cristina Rivera Garza (Headlining Author)

Cristina Rivera Garza is the award-winning author of *The Taiga Syndrome* and *The Iliac Crest*, among many other books. A recipient of the 2024 Pulitzer Prize for her memoir *Liliana's Invincible Summer: A Sister's Search for Justice*, as well as a MacArthur "Genius" grant and the Sor Juana Inés de la Cruz Prize, Rivera Garza is professor of Hispanic studies at the University of Houston, where she also directs the creative writing program.

Claire Messud (Headlining Author)

Claire Messud is the author of six works of fiction, including the critically acclaimed *The Emperor's Children*. Her latest novel, *This Strange Eventful History*, is longlisted for the 2024 Booker prize. A recipient of Guggenheim and Radcliffe fellowships and the Strauss Living Award

from the American Academy of Arts and Letters, she teaches at Harvard University and lives in Cambridge, Massachusetts.

Mark Updegrove (Emcee)

Mark K. Updegrove is the president and CEO of the <u>LBJ Foundation</u> and presidential historian for ABC News. He is the author of five books on the presidency, including *Incomparable Grace: JFK in Presidency*. Earlier in his career, he was the director of the LBJ Presidential Library and publisher of *Newsweek*. He has interviewed seven U.S. presidents.

Gala proceeds fund free access to the annual Festival, year-round Reading Rock Stars and Real Reads programs in Title I schools, collection enhancement grants to Texas public libraries across the state, and free literary programming throughout the year. Gala authors will also be featured in programming during Festival Weekend, November 16–17, to discuss their latest books.
