Texas Book Festival Honors Author and Poet Naomi Shihab Nye with 2024 Texas Writer Award

(Austin, Texas) - The <u>Texas Book Festival</u> (TBF), an annual literary event celebrating books and authors from a wide range of genres, today announced that **Naomi Shihab Nye**, a Palestinian-American poet, editor, and educator, is the 2024 recipient of the Texas Writer Award.

Each year, TBF presents the prestigious Texas Writer Award (formerly the Bookend Award) to a writer from the Lone Star State who has profoundly impacted Texas literature.

A resident of San Antonio, Nye is known for her diverse body of work which spans poetry, fiction, and children's literature. Her celebrated books include *Everything Comes Next*, *The Tiny Journalist*, *Voices in the Air*, *Sitti's Secrets*, *Habibi*, *This Same Sky*, *The Tree is Older than You Are: Poems and Paintings from Mexico*, 19 Varieties of Gazelle: Poems of the Middle East, The Turtle of Oman, and The Turtle of Michigan.

"Naomi Shihab Nye is not only a profoundly gifted and accomplished writer, but also a dedicated educator and cherished figure in the Texas literary community," said TBF Literary Director Hannah Gabel. "We're thrilled to celebrate her remarkable body of work with this year's Texas Writer Award."

Nye will be honored with a pair of custom handmade boots from El Paso-based artisanal bootmaker <u>Rocketbuster</u> during a special Festival Weekend ceremony. Festival attendees will also be able to see Nye during Festival Weekend sessions for her two 2024 releases: <u>I Know About a Thousand Things: The Writings of Ann Alejandro of Uvalde, Texas</u> (edited by Naomi Shihab Nye and Marion Winik) and <u>Grace Notes</u>, her poetry collection for young adults.

"It's an honor and a pleasure to be acknowledged in the amazing state I have embraced as my own for so many years," said Nye.

Nye has garnered recognition throughout her writing career for her various literary achievements, including Lifetime Achievement Awards from the Texas Institute of Letters, the

National Book Critics Circle, and the Arab American Museum. Additionally, she has served as the Young People's Poet Laureate for the U.S. Poetry Foundation and was the poetry editor for *The New York Times* magazine and the *Texas Observer*. A graduate of Trinity University, Nye is a visiting writer in schools and is currently a writer-in-residence at Texas State University.

This year's Festival begins at 10 a.m. on Saturday, Nov. 16, and 11 a.m. on Sunday, Nov. 17, in and around the State Capitol. Admission is free with the exception of two ticketed programs for headlining authors Matthew McConaughey and Malcolm Gladwell. Festival goers can participate in author readings, panel discussions, and signings as part of the weekend's events. There will be exhibitor booths, food vendors, and an array of family activities. Public transportation is strongly encouraged.
