Olamaie Hosts Fundraising Brunch for Texas Book Festival with Cookbook Author Khushbu Shah, November 17

(Austin, Texas) - The 2024 <u>Texas Book Festival</u> will host distinguished food writer and cookbook author Khushbu Shah for a fundraising brunch collaboration with Olamaie Executive Chef Michael Fojtasek on Sunday, November 17 at 11:00 a.m. Brunch tickets, on sale <u>now</u>, include a signed copy of Shah's debut cookbook, *Amrikan*, and three Olamaie-original courses, inspired by Shah's recipes. The special brunch event takes place during the 29th annual festival weekend.

<u>Amrikan</u>, Shah's debut cookbook, features 125 recipes influenced by the Indian Diaspora. The book is a collection of thoughtful and flavor-packed recipes acquired from her own experiences where, in her words, "the main ingredient is the Indian American culinary lexicon."

The event will start with appetizers served by Olamaie, and guests can socialize with Shah throughout the afternoon. Shah has traveled across the U.S. as the restaurant editor of *Food and Wine* magazine. Her work can be found in the *New York Times*, *Washington Post*, *GQ*, Eater.com, and more.

Tickets are \$135 and include a signed copy of *Amrikan*. Advance ticket purchase is highly recommended; sales close on November 8. <u>Purchase tickets here.</u>

Executive Chef Michael Fojtasek says, "We're very excited to host Khushbu Shah and *Amrikan* at Olamaie for The Texas Book Festival. The book is beautiful and approachable.
